Dear Patrons,

We all know that public libraries like ours are free to visit and free to use. Less well known is how libraries are funded. In New York, library funding structures vary widely. In 2012 the Southeast Steuben County Library received about 50 percent of its operating expenses from the City of Corning and the towns of Erwin, Corning, Campbell, Caton and Hornby. The balance was paid for through grants, proceeds from Friends of the Library book sales, earnings from our endowment, private contributions and fees & fines.

We are grateful for the continued financial support of our member municipalities, and equally grateful for the financial support we receive from the Friends of the Library and from donors to our annual fund and endowment. Other important funding sources include the State of New York's Construction Aid for Libraries program and grants-making agencies including the Community Foundation of Elmira-Corning and the Finger Lakes.

For example, the library circulated 244,981 books and other media last year, including downloadable eBooks, e-Readers and even laptop computers.
